Reduced risk of **fatal myocardial infarction** (heart attack)

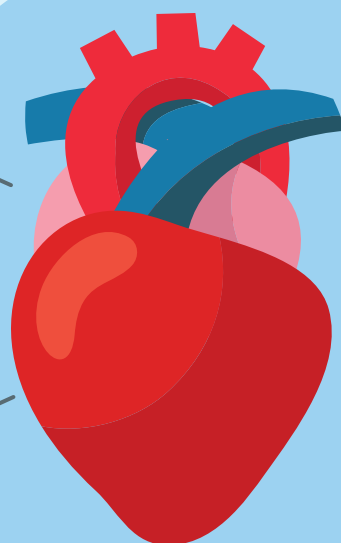
